Treasurer's Report.

Board Issues:

- Ben asked what action might be required if the bacteriological sample on well #1 failed again.
- Terry's reply: We might have to perform monthly tests on the well in addition to our testing of the distribution system. Terry did remind the board that the presence of some (non-pathogen) bacteria is one reason that we chlorinate our water system.
